
GRANTS




SLF NEWS & UPDATES




OPPORTUNTIIES FOR WRITERS

When:

Applications are open from January 4 through March 1, 2023. (Clarion West charges a nonrefundable application fee of S60 (USD), which is payable via Square. There is an early bird special of S35 for applications received before February 15.)

What: Every summer, Clarion welcomes a cohort of emerging writers to the workshop. Students have the opportunity to make intimate connections among a close-knit community of peers. They are joined each week by a different instructor — a highly regarded author or editor — who offers a unique perspective on the field.
