Submissions Period Is Open for the Speculative Literature Foundation's 2024 A.C. Bose Grant for South Asian Speculative Literature.

**January 2024**—The Speculative Literature Foundation is now accepting applications for the 2024 A.C. Bose Grant for South Asian Speculative Literature. Applications will be open through January 31, 2024.

The \$1,000 **A.C. Bose Grant for South Asian Speculative Literature**, co-sponsored by the SLF and DesiLit, is awarded to a South Asian or South Asian diaspora writer developing speculative fiction. The grant is named in memory of Ashim Chandra Bose, a lover of books, especially science fiction and fantasy, and was founded by his children, Rupa Bose and Gautam Bose.
