Paul Ryan O'Connor wins Speculative Literature Foundation's 2024 Older Writers Grant

**November 2024**—The Speculative Literature Foundation is pleased to announce Paul Ryan O'Connor as the winner of the 2024 Older Writers Grant.

O'Connor's winning piece is *Gumshoe Frankenstein*.

Paul Ryan O'Connor is a frequent contributor to *Ellery Queen Mystery Magazine*, where his short story debut, "Teddy's Favorite Thing," was voted a 2023 Readers Award. His stories have also appeared at *Mystery Magazine* and *Shotgun Honey*. His as-yet unpublished first novel, *Gumshoe Frankenstein*, is a hard boiled 1950s noir where the detective might be Frankenstein's Monster.
